Ohio State Fair returns this summer

COLUMBUS— Ohio Governor Mike DeWine and Ohio Expo Center & State Fair General Manager Virgil Strickler announced that the 2022 Ohio State Fair will reopen to the public this year, running from July 27 to Aug. 7.

"The Ohio State Fair brings people together. It's a place where we can all celebrate our great state and make memories that will last a lifetime," said



Governor DeWine. "Fran and I absolutely love fairs, none more than the Ohio State Fair.

"We have experienced so many remarkable

moments with our children and grandchildren at fairs over the years, and this summer, we can't wait to enjoy the Ohio State Fair once again."

The 2020 fair was completely canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Last year, it was closed to the public, focusing on agricultural and educational competitions.

This year's 167th Ohio State Fair is possible thanks to the hard work of thousands of staff members,

exhibitors, volunteers, vendors, partners, performers, concessionaires, youth leaders, and sponsors.

At this time, the Ohio State Fair staff are actively working on enhancements that will make this year's Ohio State Fair safe, fun, and memorable.

"When we open our gates, people will be able to rediscover the Ohio State Fair," Strickler said.

"This summer, all of our fair favorites will return. You'll be able to walk

through the barn, see the iconic butter cow, try some deep-fried food on a stick, listen to music, browse arts exhibitions, watch performances by the All-Ohio State Fair Band and Youth Choir, visit with Smokey Bear, learn about agriculture, and so much more."

During the 2019 Ohio State Fair, 934,925 people attended during the event's 12-day run. These attendees came from each of Ohio's 88 counties, all 50 states, the District of

Columbia, as well as Canada and Mexico.

The first big-name acts in this year's Ohio State Fair Concert & Event Series will be announced by the Ohio Expo Center and State Fair on Monday, March 7, with additional announcements to follow on March 21 and April 4.

Russia attacks Ukraine; peace in Europe 'shattered'

KYIV, Ukraine (AP) — Russia launched a full-scale invasion of Ukraine on Thursday, unleashing airstrikes on cities and military bases and sending troops and tanks from multiple directions in a move that could rewrite the world's geopolitical landscape. Ukraine's government pleaded for help as civilians piled into trains and cars to flee.

President Vladimir Putin ignored global condemnation and cascading new sanctions as he unleashed the largest ground war in Europe in decades, and chillingly referred to his country's nuclear arsenal. He threatened any country trying to interfere with "consequences you have never seen."

Ukrainian officials said their forces were battling Russians on a multiple fronts, and had lost control of the decommissioned Chernobyl nuclear power plant, scene of the world's worst nuclear disaster.

"Russia has embarked on a path of evil, but Ukraine is defending itself and won't give up its freedom," Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy tweeted.

In Washington, U.S. President Joe Biden announced new sanctions against Russia, saying Putin "chose this war" and that his country would bear the consequences of his action.

The sanctions will target Russian banks, oligarchs, state-controlled companies and high-tech sectors, he said, adding they were designed not to disrupt global energy markets. Russian oil and natural gas exports are vital energy sources for Europe.

Zelenskyy urged the U.S. and West to go further and cut the Russians from the SWIFT system, a key financial network that connects thousands of banks around the world. The White House has been reluctant to im-

mediately cut Russia from SWIFT, worried it could cause enormous economic problems in Europe and elsewhere in the West.

Zelenskyy, who earlier cut diplomatic ties with Moscow and declared martial law, described Russian forces advancing on a series of fronts, including a "difficult situation" developing in Kharkiv, Ukraine's second-largest city, just over 20 kilometers away from the eastern border with Russia, and Russian troops slowly advancing from the north on the city of Chernihiv. He said a Russian airborne unit at an airport just outside Kyiv, the capital, was being destroyed.

He appealed to global leaders, saying that "if you don't help us now, if you fail to offer a powerful assistance to Ukraine, tomorrow the war will knock on your door."

Both sides claimed to have destroyed some of the other's aircraft and military hardware, though little of that could be confirmed.

Russian forces seized control of the now-unused Chernobyl plant and its surrounding exclusion zone after a fierce battle, Zelenskyy adviser Myhailo Podolyak told The Associated Press.

Columbus woman arrested for passing fake check

Alicia C. Adelsberger, 30, of Columbus, was arrested Wednesday for felony counterfeiting after she admitted she was part of a counterfeit check-cashing ring.

Officers of the Bellefontaine Police Department were called to Richwood Banking Co., 120 E. Sandusky Ave., at 10:10 a.m. when Adelsberger came into cash a bogus check. As an officer entered the bank lobby, the suspect stepped away from the teller counter and tried to hurriedly walk out of the bank.

The officer grabbed her by the arm at the door and detained her for questioning. Bank staff recognized Adelsberger from

inter-office emails identifying her as a suspect trying to pass bogus paychecks at other Richwood Bank locations.

She told officers she is a single mother of three without a job or a home. She acknowledged she knew the check was bad.

After losing her home, she agreed to work with counterfeiters in Columbus cash fake checks. She said she is paid \$200 to \$300 for each check she successfully cashes.

She was driven to Bellefontaine and dropped off a block east of the bank prior to her latest attempt.

She was lodged in the Logan County Jail.

BLES staff trained in 'Handle With Care' program

The impact of trauma on learning was the focus of a recent Benjamin Logan Elementary School staff training.

Ohio Handle With Care is a trauma-informed, cross-systems, collaborative program aimed at ensuring that children who are exposed to adverse events receive appropriate interventions and have opportunities to build resilience through positive relationships with teachers and first responders.

Cecilia Yelton, Mental Health Drug and Alcohol Services Board of Logan and Champaign Counties director of school and community-based Prevention, led BLES teachers and support staff through the training, where

they learned how to incorporate interventions to mitigate the negative impact of trauma for identified students.

"Handle with Care" provides the school or child care agency with a "heads up" when a child has been identified at the scene of a traumatic event. It could be a domestic violence situation, a death of a family member, a house fire, car accident, or other possible traumatic events.

Police and other first responders are trained to identify children at the scene, find out where they go to school or daycare and send the school/agency a confidential email that simply says . . . "Handle Johnny with care."

Some of the interventions that Yelton detailed include: sending students

to the clinic to rest (when a Handle With Care has been received and the child is having trouble staying awake or focusing); re-teaching lessons; postponing testing; small group counseling by school counselors; and referrals to counseling, social service or advocacy programs.

BLES is already implementing ways to "Handle With Care" through school-wide interventions, such as PAX Good Behavior Game, to help create a trauma sensitive school.

OHP students advance to Ohio SkillsUSA Championships

Ohio Hi-Point Career Center students had a strong showing after competing at the SkillsUSA Southwest Regional competition in February.

Students competed against other pupils from nearly 20 other career centers in a variety of event categories from construction, diesel, cosmetology, and digital media to public speaking, leadership, and parliamentary procedure.

Ian Cable, a senior in the Construction Trades program from Benjamin Logan High School, placed

first in the Carpentry event competition. For the competition, he was given a set of blueprints and tasked to frame the structure using appropriate building materials and components while meeting OSHA standards.

Micah Hermiller, a senior in the Graphic and Media Arts Academy program from Kenton High School, placed second in Advertising Design. He was required to demonstrate his skills by recreating a given advertisement/design within a specific amount of time while displaying his knowledge of industry terminology, concepts, and creative skills.

Ohio Hi-Point's Welding Fabrication Team consisting of Thomas Carl (USV), Jason Helton (USV), Michael Hoffman (Marysville), placed third in the Welding and Fab Team Event. The students were tasked to fabricate a steel bookshelf from 3/16" material. The shelf is removable and can be staged in three different places.

These students, in addition to advancing to the

state competition, received industry gear and tools to continue their careers.

The Ohio SkillsUSA Championships take place at the end of March. Students will compete with over 5,000 competitors in 100 contests in 16 career pathways for the title of best in Ohio in their respective career fields.

Business and industry partners, instructors, and

vendors work with the students to showcase Career and Technical Education in Ohio.

SkillsUSA is the largest career technical student organization and improves the quality of America's skilled workforce through a structured program of citizenship, leadership, employability, technical and professional skills training.

Gophers end season with sectional tourney loss against Minster

Ridgemont's boys basketball team was knocked out of the postseason Wednesday with a 66-39 loss to Minster in a Division IV sectional tournament game at Coldwater High School.

The Gophers finish the season with a record of 14-9.

Minster (5-17) advances to play Marion Local today.

Ridgemont had to play without senior standout Mason Stuck.

The Gophers trailed by four points (15-11) after one quarter and fell behind by 13 (36-23) at halftime.

Minster pushed its lead to 20 points (52-32) after three quarters.

The Wildcats did most of their damage from long range as they canned 14 three-pointers on the night.

Landon Newland closed out his sensational prep career for the Gophers with 13 points. Lane

Underwood had nine points and Colton

Whitaker added five points.

The Gophers will have some big shoes to fill moving forward with the loss of a talented senior class.

"I love this group of seniors. I wouldn't be coaching without these five," said Ridgemont head coach Nick Stuck. "They breathed life back into me after a few rough years. I will forever be grateful. From here, the program looks a lot different.

Three of these guys are four-year lettermen. Landon and Mason have combined for 3,371 career points. You don't just replace that. I hope the fans understand how lucky they have been to watch some really good basketball players. These guys are generational talents."

No. 17 Ohio State women clinch top-4 seed in Big Ten tourney

COLUMBUS (AP) — Taylor Mikesell scored 19 points, Tanaya Beacham added 18 points and No. 17 Ohio State beat Penn State 78-55 on Thursday night to clinch a top-four seed in the Big Ten Conference tournament.

Ohio State held the Big Ten's second-leading scorer, Makenna Marisa at 22.8 points per game, to just 10 points on 3-of-18 shooting. Penn State was just 19 of 62 from the floor (30.6%) and turned it over 20 times, leading to 22 Ohio State

points.

Jacy Sheldon added eight points for Ohio State (21-5, 13-4), which has won 12 of the last 13 meetings with the Nittany Lions — including the last seven at home.

Ohio State closed the

first half on a 16-2 run as Penn State went the final 6 minutes, 40 seconds without a made field goal. The Lady Lions were 8-of-32 shooting (25%) in the first half, including 2 of 11 from 3-point range. Ohio State wasn't much better, shoot-

ing 36.1% overall and 1 of 12 from distance.

Niya Beverley scored 12 points and Leilani Kapinus recorded her second double-double of the season with 10 points and 12 rebounds for Penn State (11-16, 5-12).

The start of the fourth quarter was delayed due to an electrical outage affecting the shot clocks.

Ohio State closes its regular season at Michigan State on Sunday. Penn State hosts Minnesota on Sunday.

Aikman expected to leave Fox for ESPN 'Monday Night' booth

NFL free agency doesn't begin for a few more weeks, however business is about to pick up when it comes to shuffling among the network broadcast

teams with perhaps the biggest surprise of them all.

Troy Aikman is expected to become the lead analyst on ESPN's "Monday Night Football" after 22 years with Fox. The New York Post reported that Aikman will sign a five-year deal

that would rival the \$17.5 million per year Tony Romo is making at CBS.

ESPN and Fox had no comment on Aikman's future.

Aikman has been with Joe Buck on Fox's top crew since 2002, but there have been rumblings the past couple of

months that the Hall of Fame quarterback had been looking to move on.

Many thought that Aikman would join Al Michaels at Amazon, which takes over "Thursday Night Football" next season. Instead, it is ESPN, which

has its star quarterback after falling short with Romo and Peyton Manning in recent seasons.

ESPN chairman Jimmy Pitaro had tried to get Manning for years to join the "Monday Night Football" booth since he

retired after the 2015 season. Pitaro's patience paid off last year when the Manningcast with Peyton and Eli Manning debuted to rave reviews. The 10-game "Monday Night Football with Peyton and Eli" package runs through 2024.

Surprise: Kurt Kitayama shoots 64 to lead Honda Classic

PALM BEACH GARDENS, Fla. (AP) — Kurt Kitayama came into the Honda Classic with 25 previous appearances on the PGA Tour, most of them ending by missing the cut.

He's on track to do a bit better this week in the Honda Classic.

Kitayama — ranked No. 289 in the world — was nearly flawless at PGA National on Thursday, shooting a 6-under 64 to take a one-shot lead over Daniel Berger, Chris Kirk and Rory Sabbatini. It was Kitayama's best score in 69 rounds on the PGA Tour, fueled by a career-best run of four consecutive birdies on his second nine.

And he qualifies as a surprise leader, considering even he didn't expect a start like this.

"Maybe not a start like that, but I felt like I've been playing well, and I've started to figure out my putting to kind of find this kind of round," said Kitayama, a California native and former UNLV player who has missed cuts 64% of the time — 16 out of 25 — in tour events.

Berger also was bogey-free, and missed an 8-foot birdie try on the par-5 18th to settle for 65.

Peter Uihlein and Danny

Willett were among the group at 67. Brooks Koepka, a Palm Beach County native basically playing a home game this week, was in a group at 68. And Joaquin Niemann, the Genesis last week at Riviera in Los Angeles, was 4 under through 12 before giving it all back and settling for an even-par 70.

"I didn't do anything to really deserve to be 4 or 5

under," Koepka said. "That's a great score here. Just kind of ho-hummed it around."

After several days of off-course drama coming from Phil Mickelson's words, Greg Norman's wants and the PGA Tour going on the offensive, there may have been hope that on-course events would return to the forefront.

Norman decided he wanted otherwise.

Norman — who runs LIV Golf Investments, the group financed mainly by the Saudi Arabia sovereign wealth fund chaired by Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman — offered the latest twist by releasing a letter he sent to PGA Tour Commissioner Jay Monahan. Norman

accused Monahan of "bullying and intimidating" players into staying on the tour and spurning the proposed super league. Norman has been working on with the Saudis.

He says players want to play. It's unclear who does; many top players in recent days have insisted otherwise, and Rory McIlroy went as far as to say the notion was "dead in the water."

"I know for a fact that many PGA players were and still are interested in playing for a new league, in addition to playing for the Tour," Norman wrote to Monahan. "What is wrong with that?"

Monahan said this week that players who sign up for a Saudi golf league will lose their PGA Tour membership and should not expect to get it back.

In other news, actual golf was played.

Kitayama started on the back nine, opened with three consecutive birdies, then had the run of four consecutive birdies — capped by rolling in a 20-footer from just off the green on the par-4 6th, his 15th hole of the day.

"Conditions of the course are perfect," Kitayama said. "It's just really tough."

He made it look easy. So did Sabbatini and Berger.

Sabbatini, the 2011 Honda winner, had a bogey-free round of 65 with four birdies on the back nine. It was the first time Sabbatini played PGA National as a pro without making a single bogey.

"I'm very well aware of it," Sabbatini said.

Berger — whose back has been iffy in recent weeks — was 5 under through 11, then finished with seven consecutive pars.

"It's nice to get off to a good start," said Berger, who grew up playing junior golf at PGA National.

Neither Kitayama nor Sabbatini is a bomber; Kitayama entered the week tied for 74th in driving distance on tour, Sabbatini tied for 172nd. That makes PGA National to their liking, considering it's not a course that gets overpowered.

"I'm getting to that point in my game where I think I've gotten past where I feel like, I hate to say it, truly competitive out here," the 45-year-old Sabbatini said. "There's too many guys out here that have much more firepower, so I've just got to kind of pick and choose my way around the golf course."
