DD Awareness Month

Ramp project affords independence to area resident

March is National Developmental Awareness Month and one local individual is celebrating newfound independence thanks to assistance from the Logan County Board of Developmental Disabilities.

After a very difficult period in her life, Angie was connected with Logan County Board of DD services in 2020 for her cerebral palsy.

"Angie was starting over with nothing but her own courage and strength," Board of DD case worker Kara Fanaff explained. "We reconnected her with her physicians, connected her with Board of DD services that could help her with everyday life and helped her apply for Social Security."

In the summer of 2021, Angie moved into her own home — a rent-to-own trailer — and she has

worked hard to make it her own.

Due to her CP, Angie currently uses a walker or crutches to walk. The new home only had stairs leading to her front door, making it difficult, and sometimes unsafe, for her to navigate.

Fanaff set out to find a provider to solve this problem — which posed some challenges along the way.

"We began the search for a provider able to complete a ramp for the home in September 2021. It was very difficult to find a provider able or willing to complete the project," she said.

"We finally came across a company, Home Improvment LLC, which is a Medicaid waiver provider and they were very willing to complete the ramp."

The workers battled through freezing weather to finish the ramp in January to ensure that Angie had a safe way to get in and out of her home in snowy weather.

"Angie is so excited to have her new ramp at her home," Fanaff continued. "This makes her even more

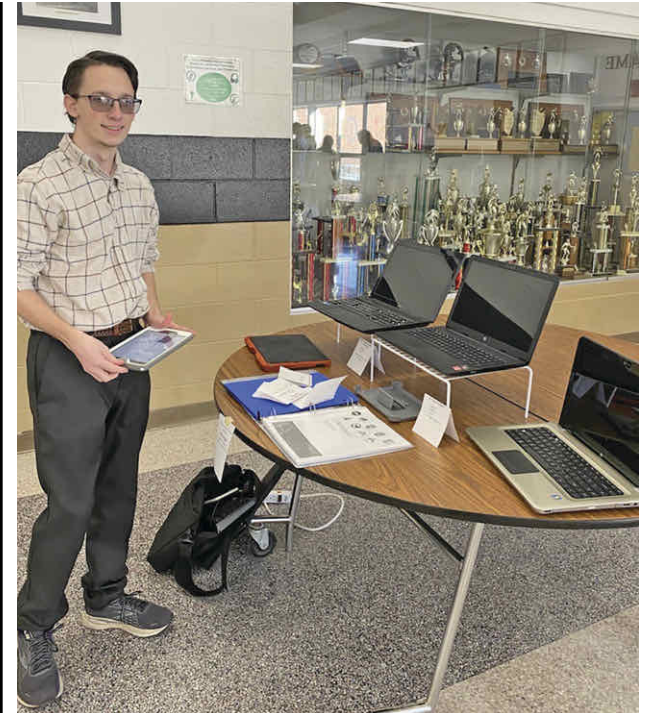
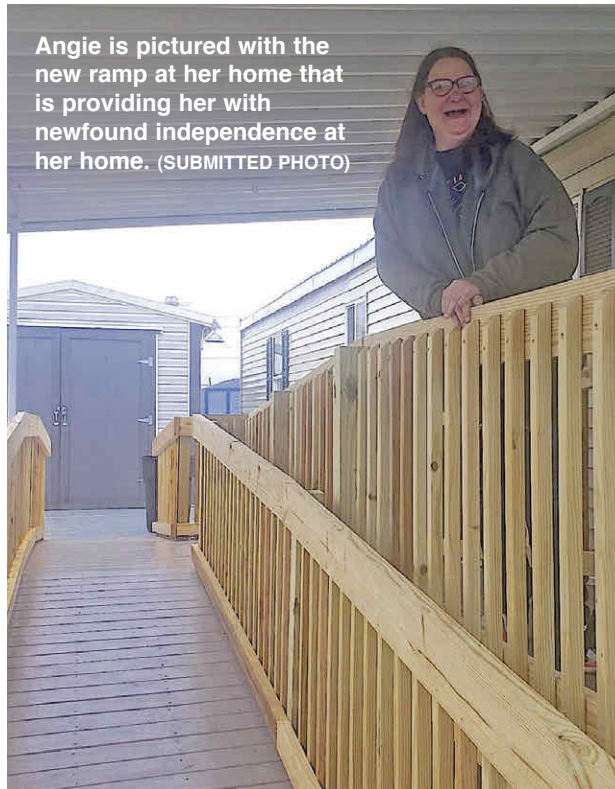
independent and she is loving it. We are so happy for Angie to continue her journey to happiness."

Since being linked with the LCBDD, Angie has also made friends and connections. By attending programming through RTC,

she now has an independent provider and has lost approximately 50 pounds, in addition to the added independence of her new home and ramp.

Bellefontaine's Kayla Watkins is headed to the Division I girls state bowling tournament.

Watkins was at her best during Thursday's sectional tour-

namment at Beaver-Vu Lanes, rolling an impressive 668 series. That placed Watkins third overall and gave her the second individual qualifying berth for the state tourney.

The top five teams and top five bowlers not on a qualifying

team earned spots at state.

Watkins, a junior, fired a 278 game to go along with a 176 and a 214. Troy's Kayleigh McMullen had the top series with a 688 and Wilmington's Kylie Fisher was second with a 671.

Bellefontaine's Akayla Ryan also participated Thursday and finished with games of 159, 165 and 159 for a 483 series.

The Division I state bowling tournament is Saturday, March 12, at Wayne Webb's Columbus Bowl.

Area basketball players receive all-Southwest District honors

A total of 16 local prep basketball players earned all-Southwest District accolades this winter.

The all-district teams are selected by a panel of media members from across the district.

The highest local honor went to Indian Lake sophomore Caiden Nicol, who was named to the Division III boys third team.

Nicol, a guard, is averaging 16.3 points, 7.5 rebounds, 3.8 assists and 2.3 steals per game entering the Lakers' district final game against Cincinnati Taft on Saturday.

In last weekend's sectional final against Dayton Christian, Nicol scored 18 points in the first quarter alone. He went on to finish with 24 in the Lakers' 69-59 victory.

Three of Nicol's teammates, seniors Luke Jackson and Caleb Wurster and sophomore Camdon Tuttle, were selected to the Division III honorable mention list.

Wurster is averaging 14.1 points, 6.1 rebounds and 5 assists per game, Jackson is contributing 13.4 points, 4.5 rebounds and 2 assists per contest and Tuttle is adding 12.4 points, 6.3 rebounds and 2.1 assists

per game for the Lakers.

Also earning honorable mention honors in Division III for the boys were West Liberty-Salem's Logan Saylor and Matt Jones and Triad's Ayden Spriggs and Ayden Sanford.

A senior, Saylor led the Tigers with 13.4 points and seven rebounds per game. His teammate Jones, a junior, averaged 8.9 points and 3.2 rebounds per contest. He shot 43 percent from three-point range.

Spriggs and Sanford, both seniors, helped Triad to a big turnaround this season. Spriggs averaged 12.9 points and 6.2 rebounds per game, while

Sanford collected averages of 10.5 points and 4.7 rebounds.

There were two local boys on the Division II honorable mention list in Bellefontaine's C.J. Wilson and Benjamin Logan's Kaden Arn.

Wilson, a sophomore, led the Chiefs in scoring at 8.6 points per game. He also chipped in 2.5 rebounds per contest.

A senior, Arn powered the Raiders by averaging 14.4 points and 8.1 rebounds per game.

Riverside sophomore Myles Platfoot was an honorable mention selection for the Division IV all-dis-

trict team. He averaged 9.5 points, 4.2 rebounds and 2.8 assists per game.

On the girls side, there were five area players receiving honorable mention awards.

In Division II, Benjamin Logan senior Lynzee Cronkleton and Bellefontaine senior Tayteum Vigansky were honorable mention selections.

Cronkleton led the Raiders in scoring this winter at 14.7 points per game. She also averaged 3.2 rebounds and 3.8 steals.

Vigansky was a versatile weapon for the Chiefs, averaging 10.1 points, 5.3 rebounds, 3 steals and 2.4

blocks per game.

West Liberty-Salem's Chaley Wade and Indian Lake's Stephanie Altstaetter were named to the honorable mention list in Division III.

A sophomore, Wade scored 9.5 points and pulled down 8.6 rebounds per game in her first year starting for the Tigers.

A junior, Altstaetter sparked the Lakers by averaging 13.2 points and 8.9 rebounds per contest.

Riverside's Jade Copas was an honorable mention pick in Division IV. Copas, a junior, averaged 7.3 points and 7.1 rebounds per game.

Coach K down to a final game at Cameron

DURHAM, N.C. (AP) — Duke's Mike Krzyzewski has spent more than four decades preparing seniors for managing the emotions that come with taking the court a final time at Cameron Indoor Stadium.

This week, the retiring Hall of Famer must do that for someone new: himself.

"Little bit of thinking yesterday: 'This is your last game at Cameron,' Krzyzewski said Thursday, two days before his fourth-ranked Blue Devils host North Carolina to close the regular season. "It's crazy, how did that happen? How is it here? ... I'll have to spend some time, have a meeting with me.

"Maybe a few tough talks about keeping my eyes on the road, so to speak."

The 75-year-old known to many as "Coach K" has spent the better part of a year deflecting questions about his looming retirement and trying to avoid being a distraction or creating additional pressure on his fourth-ranked Blue Devils. The approach has worked, with a roster led by players with NBA futures securing the program's

outright first Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season title since 2006.

Now there are no more deflections, no more chances to push questions into the distance. The moment is here, with Krzyzewski down to one home game — fittingly against the rival Tar Heels — and no more than 10 games left in an impressive career.

As Krzyzewski said he told his staff Thursday morning: "Who would've ever thought? It's my Senior Day."

"I think I'm just going to overall — I'm talking to myself right now — just let it happen," Krzyzewski said. "And see what the hell happens. But try not to let it negatively influence anything for my players, because look, for them, it's their game. ... And I'm responsible for making sure that they have the best chance to win that game."

Krzyzewski's resume includes a college-coaching record 1,196 victories to go with five NCAA championships. So much of that success originated in the 82-year-old campus arena, with its cramped confines (9,314 capacity) and rowdy

students packed into bleachers practically on top of the court along the length of the sideline to create an intimidating and ear-ringing homecourt advantage.

In all, Krzyzewski has a 572-75 record (.884) in 42 seasons of home games.

His Cameron farewell will be an emotional spectacle, adding another layer to a rivalry that annually commands the spotlight and features neighboring teams with a combined 11 NCAA championships.

The cheapest ticket on StubHub as of Thursday

afternoon was \$3,250, with seats climbing north of \$10,000 — including some with asking prices of \$50,000 and, improbably, \$99,988 each. The school expects around 80 of Krzyzewski's former Duke players to attend, just one example of how his influ-

ence on the sport will continue long past his retirement.

Steve Wojciechowski will be among that group.

The former Blue Devils defensive-minded point guard best known as "Wojo" became an assistant on Krzyzewski's staff before spending seven seasons as Marquette's head coach until last year. His enduring Cameron moment came on his Senior Day in 1998, when Duke rallied to beat a North Carolina team featuring future NBA players Antawn Jamison and Vince Carter.

At the horn, Wojciechowski turned and ran straight to Krzyzewski for a firm and lasting hug amid the rare sight of "Cameron Crazies" storming the court to celebrate.

"It's surreal," Wojciechowski said. "How many things in your life have been consistent over a 40-year period, where you know you go somewhere and turn on the TV, there's a constant there that you can depend on? In all of our lives? Very few. Duke, and Coach K being there, is one of them."

Rory McIlroy with 65 off to another great start at Bay Hill

ORLANDO, Fla. (AP) — Rory McIlroy opened with a 7-under 65 on Thursday and had reason to expect a score like this at Bay Hill, not so much because of the course but rather the day of the week.

Good starts have not been a problem for McIlroy at the Arnold Palmer Invitational the last two years. Now it's about keeping them going to the finish line.

With three birdies and a 40-foot eagle on the par 5s, McIlroy had his lowest start at Bay Hill and a two-shot lead over Billy Horschel, Beau Hossler and J.J. Spaun.

Adam Scott, Graeme McDowell and Ian Poulter, who dressed in Ukrainian colors, were in the group three shots behind at 68.

"I think you turn up at any golf course where you've had success, and automatically you're going to have some confidence coming in," said McIlroy, who won at Bay Hill in 2018 and hasn't finished out of the top 10 the last five years.

He opened with a 66 each of the last two years, both times failing to break par on the weekend.

But there is a rhythm to playing Bay Hill that makes McIlroy comfortable, mainly taking advantage of the par 5s and some of the shorter par 4s. He had eagle putts on three of the par 5s, making the long one up the ridge on the 16th, his seventh hole of the round.

"I played the par 5s particularly well, and that was the bulk of the score," he said. "I've said this all along, you can play within yourself here and still shoot a good score, I feel, if you're just disciplined and pick off the birdies where you're supposed to."

Jon Rahm, the world's No. 1 player, made his Bay Hill debut with a 72 that included one extra stroke he didn't anticipate. He went to rap in a 10-inch par putt on the seventh hole, didn't feel right and tried to stop the stroke only for it to nudge the ball an inch.

"I wish I could give you all the excuses in the world, but no, it's as simple as it just didn't feel good in my hands, and I tried to stop, and I didn't. I just simply didn't stop," Rahm said. "I don't know. It was very odd."

McIlroy played alongside Scott, a delight for the largest gallery of the morning who enjoy watching two pure swings with the driver. There was an exception this time. Scott decided to leave driver out of the bag in an attempt to hit more fairways and avoid rough that is thicker than usual.

How did it work out? "Not bad for me — 68 — I mean, that's not bad," Scott said.

As for his accuracy, he hit only seven of the 14 fairways. Asked if he would go without a driver at the TPC Sawgrass next week, Scott wasn't even sure what he would do Friday.

It still was a comfortable start, especially playing with McIlroy and seeing the four-time major champion make it look easy on a course that held its own in ideal weather.

"I like playing with Rory. I really enjoy watching him

play," Scott said. "He's a guy I can watch play and get positive swing thoughts for myself. I love watching him swing a golf club. I think almost everyone in the world would say that."

McIlroy already has one win this season on the PGA Tour, at the CJ Cup in Las Vegas last fall, though he let one opportunity slip this year when he had the lead on the back nine in Dubai until a series of bogeys cost him.

His lone victory at Bay Hill was a 67-64 finish, so he does know how to close.

McDowell has a pair of runner-up finishes in the Arnold Palmer Invitational and now is one of the biggest supporters of the lone PGA Tour event in his adopted hometown. He is trying to get his game pointed in the right direction and feels it is trending.

His last win on the PGA Tour was in the Dominican Republic in 2019. His victory in the Saudi International a year later got him back into the top 50 in the world and earned him another spot in the Masters. Since that Saudi win, McDowell has only one top 10 and is at No. 399.
