## Mock crash staged prior to BHS prom this weekend

The Bellefontaine High School DARE Club performed an alcohol-related mock crash Wednesday afternoon to promote safe driving with prom and graduation season approaching.

The head-on crash was staged at the Logan County Fairgrounds in front of the grandstand. Juniors and seniors attended the event.

First responders reported on the dangers of impaired and distracted

driving, noting that motor vehicle crashes are the second leading cause of death for U.S. teens.

Each day, about seven teens die from motor vehicle crash injuries nationwide.

Per mile driven, teen drivers (age 16-19) are nearly three times as likely as drivers age 20 or older to be in a fatal crash.

According to the Ohio State Highway Patrol, 58 percent of those killed in a crash since 2015 were

not wearing a seat belt.

From 2016-2020, there were 66,181 distracted driving crashes in Ohio, which resulted in 212 deaths.

In the mock accident, senior Connor Skidmore acted as an impaired driver. He collided head-on with an SUV operated by senior Mackenzie Southard.

Skidmore's passenger, junior Keagon Overton-

Story, was ejected.

Overton-Story, who was not wearing a seat belt, was pronounced dead in the mock crash.

Skidmore had minor injuries and was arrested at the scene.

Southard and her passenger, junior Mekenzie Flora, suffered serious injuries. Flora was transported by squad to the hospital.

Southard was trapped and removed by the Jaws of Life. CareFlight landed at the fairgrounds and transported her to a trauma center. Skidmore, Southard, and Flora were wearing their seat belts.

Senior Sam

Moreland and junior Joslyn Robinson witnessed the crash and called 911.

Moments later, the Bellefontaine Police Department and Bellefontaine Fire and EMS arrived on scene.

Finally, the students listened to a sobering presentation from Laura Seger.

Seger's son, Joey, was killed by an impaired driver near Troy in September 2010. Joey was a

senior at Piqua High School.

Seger urged each student to make wise choices. She said impaired crashes are 100 percent preventable.

Sergeant Ryan Stanley from the Marysville Post of the Ohio State Highway Patrol also spoke to the students.

Bellefontaine High School's Prom is slated for Saturday night, and commencement for the Class of 2022 is May 20.

## BPD announces next round of police officer testing

The Bellefontaine Police Department announces its next round of testing for the position of police officer.

In order to be eligible to proceed in the process, participants must first take the online exam through the National Testing Network.

This online registration process is managed by NTN itself, and not managed by the City of Bellefontaine. Each candidate must register themselves on the NTN website at the Bellefontaine Police Department location on their site.

After passing the written online exam, participants should follow the NTN's process to send their scores to the Bellefontaine Police Department. Then, participants also must have also completed the BPD's application.

Applications and NTN tests

must be completed and returned to the Bellefontaine Police Department by 4 p.m. Friday, May 27, to be eligible.

Applications are available online at the police department's website under the "Employment" tab (select NTN application), or by stopping by the agency, 135 N. Detroit St., Bellefontaine, Ohio 43311.

The department can also send an electronic version to participants upon an e-mail request. Applications may be notarized the agency, upon request while you're in-person.

Those who successfully apply and successfully pass the NTN test will participate in the physical agility testing. Two practices will be available on June 3 and June 8. The actual test is at noon Friday, June 10, at the Logan County Fairgrounds.

The Chieftain boys rolled to their title with 114.5 points, while Ben Logan was second with 76 points, Indian Lake was third with 49 points and Riverside was fourth with 16.5 points.

In the girls meet, Ben Logan tallied 96.5 points to

## Naylor, Plesac lead Guardians to sweep of White Sox

CLEVELAND (AP) — Josh Naylor had two hits and two RBIs, continuing his comeback from a devastating leg injury and helping the Cleveland Guardians complete a series sweep of the Chicago White Sox with a 6-3 victory on Thursday.

Cleveland took both games of a doubleheader Wednesday against Chicago, which has lost four straight.

Naylor hit an RBI single in the fifth and a run-scoring double in the seventh. He was activated Friday after suffering multiple fractures in his right leg during an outfield collision last June. He had surgery

and completed a lengthy rehab process that included a stint in the minors to begin this season.

Naylor pumped his fists and pointed toward Cleveland's dugout following both hits.

"It's awesome, but it's about more than me," he said. "It's about the team and we did a good job this series."

Franmil Reyes, who hit his first home run of the season, is happy to see Naylor back on the field.

"He's my best friend and it's great to see him there, playing with that big smile and cheering for the team, no matter how he's doing," Reyes said. "I

remember when he came back he was always like you've got this, it's going to be OK. So, I'm glad to be his teammate every time."

Cleveland right-hander Zach Plesac (1-1) allowed two runs, one earned, and seven hits in 6 2/3 innings. Emmanuel Clase pitched the ninth for his second save.

Reyes put Cleveland in front with a two-run shot off Dylan Cease (2-1) with two out in the third. Reyes drove in rookie Steven Kwan, who was aboard on a leadoff double.

Cease allowed four runs in 5 1/3 innings and believes better days are ahead for the White Sox,

who have been dealing with injuries to several key players.

"This happens in baseball," he said. "We dealt with it a lot last season. It's one of those things where we have to keep stepping up. It's part of the game."

Yasmani Grandal's sacrifice fly in the fourth scored Chicago's first run. The first three hitters reached base in the inning, but Luis Robert was thrown out when he tried to score on José Abreu's double.

Reyes, making a rare appearance in right field, played the towering drive off the wall. Robert waited at second base to see if the ball was caught and was

tagged out at home by Austin Hedges after the throw from Reyes to second baseman Ernie Clement.

Robert snapped an 0-for-21 skid with a leadoff double. He singled in the sixth but was thrown out trying to steal second. Robert was removed in the eighth with a minor groin strain and could possibly be placed on the injured list, according to White Sox manager Tony La Russa.

Chicago has scored 15 runs in its last seven games, but La Russa is confident the defending AL Central champions will find their groove offensively.

"We were a lot more

ourselves today," he said. "We played better, but they just outplayed us the whole series. That's what happens. We took care of our business. It wasn't enough."

Reliever Trevor Stephan and Clement had throwing errors on the same play in the seventh that allowed two unearned runs. Cleveland got both runs back in the bottom of the inning on Naylor's double and Andrés Giménez's sacrifice fly.

José Ramírez had two infield singles and has hits in all 12 games this season. He signed a seven-year, \$141 million contract last week.

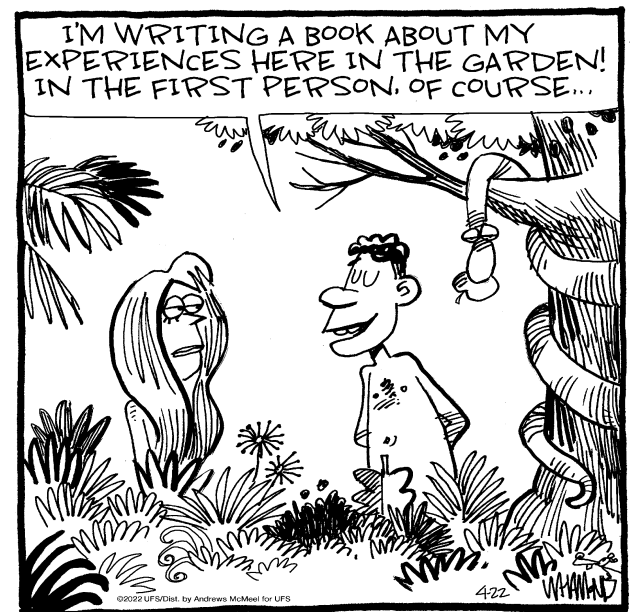

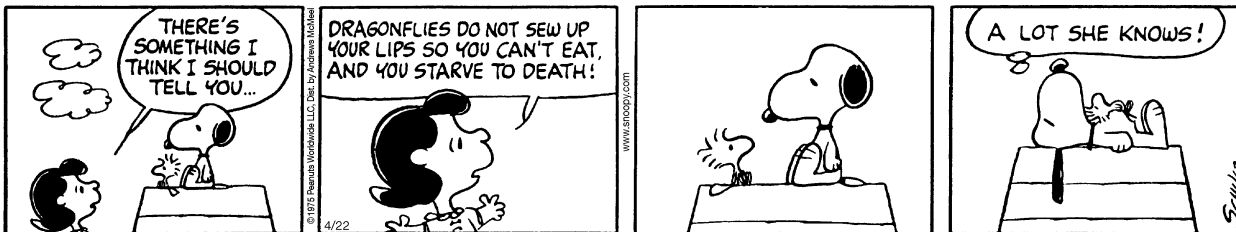

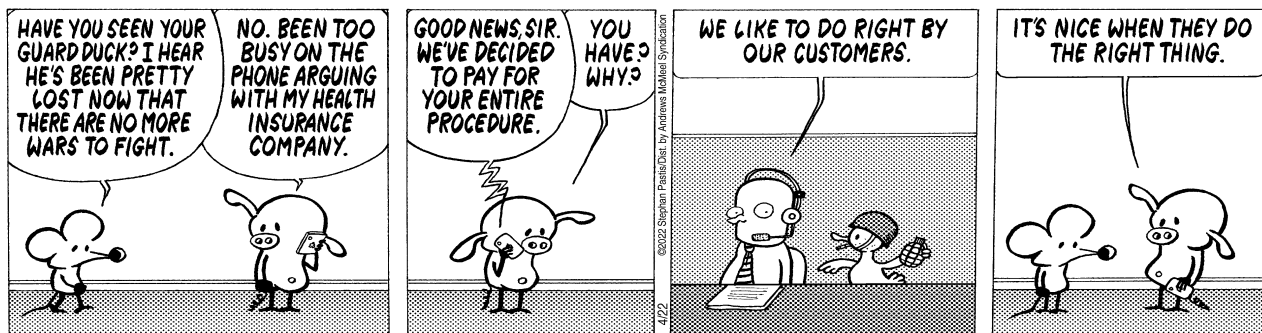
