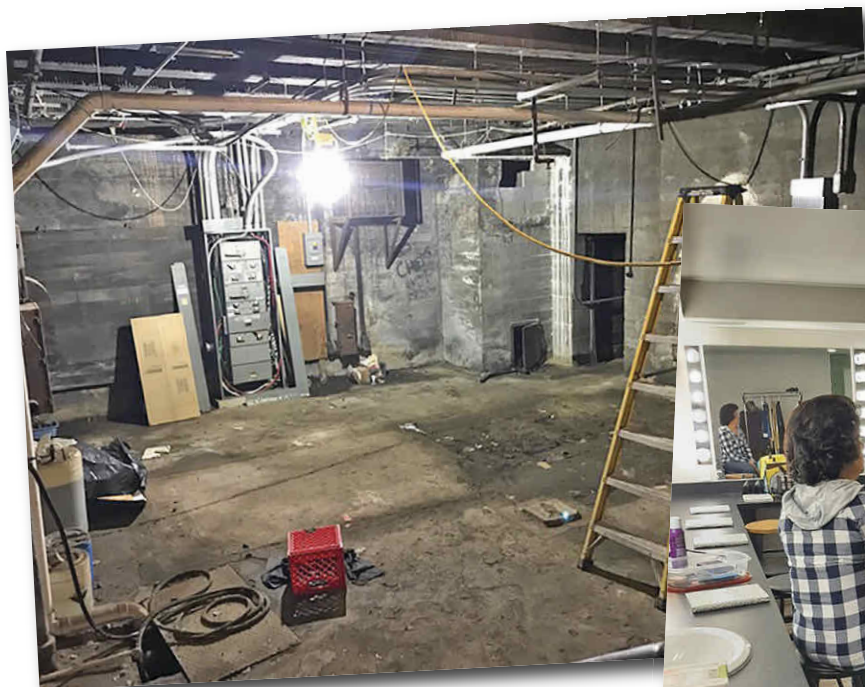

Tasty project promotes healthy snacking

A series of taste tests took place recently at Benjamin Logan High School as a way to reinforce what the younger students are learning about heart-healthy foods and smart snacking.

The high school students in Christa Knight's Principles of Foods and Global Foods classes spent time preparing and serving samples of healthy snacks to encourage second-, third- and fourth-grade students to expand their pallets.

The activity also coincided with the American Heart Association Kids Heart Challenge at Benjamin Logan Elementary.

The elementary students had the opportunity to walk over to the high school each day during their physical education class.

Having students taste healthy food items is at the heart of nutrition education because if students have the opportunity to try and

like healthier foods, they'll be more likely to become healthier eaters, the presenters noted.

To help the younger students identify the fruit or vegetable in the grocery store when shopping with parents, the high schoolers made a point to show the fruit, vegetable and other ingredients in its whole and cut up forms during the taste testing.

In addition, several recipes were shared so par-

ents can extend the tasting at home.

"A taste test encourages children to step out of their comfort zones and learn more about themselves by being brave and trying something new," Mrs. Harner said.

Jags take 'athletic freak' Walker with top pick in NFL draft

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. (AP) — Placing more emphasis on pro potential than college production, the Jacksonville Jaguars chose Georgia pass rusher Travon Walker with the top pick in the NFL draft on Thursday night.

The Jaguars took the 6-foot-5, 272-pound "athletic freak" over Michigan star Aidan Hutchinson, who set a school record with 14 sacks in 2021 and finished second in Heisman Trophy voting.

General manager Trent Baalke had been leaning toward Walker for months and insisted new coach Doug Pederson was totally in agreement on selecting the former Bulldogs defender at No. 1. Critics argued that Hutchinson was the more polished product and pointed to Walker's limited college numbers. He had 9½ sacks in three years in Athens, Georgia, including six during last sea-

son's national championship run.

But Baalke and

Pederson see a more versatile player in Walker, who logged snaps at defensive

end, defensive tackle and outside linebacker in Georgia's vaunted defense

last fall. His highlights include more than sacks; he stops the run, tackles speedy receivers in the open field and tips passes that lead to interceptions.

"He's an athletic freak," Georgia defensive coordinator Will Muschamp told The Associated Press. "I swear to God he could line up at middle linebacker and go be fine. I would take him at No. 1 and not even blink."

The Jaguars did just that.

Once a two-sport star with NBA dreams at Upson-Lee High School in Thomaston, Georgia, Walker eventually settled on football and quickly became one of the most sought-after recruits in talent-rich Georgia. He signed with the Bulldogs and played college ball a little more than 100 miles from his hometown.

He bided his time as a backup during his first two years at Georgia — he made

the league's Freshman All-SEC Team — and really started to blossom as a junior. He started all 15 games in 2021, finishing with 37 tackles, including 7½ for a loss, and two pass breakups.

Muschamp first met Walker when he was 10 years old and now considers him one of the best kids he's ever coached.

"There's not a single red flag," Muschamp said. "He's the real deal now."

Jacksonville is the fourth NFL franchise with back-to-back No. 1 picks and is hoping to become the first to nail both selections. Tampa Bay (1976-77, 1986-87), Cincinnati (1994-95) and Cleveland (1999-2000, 2017-18) all failed to find success both times.

The Jaguars believe quarterback Trevor Lawrence, the slam-dunk top choice a year ago, is on the verge of becoming a star and just needs more help around him.

Bearcats' Gardner selected by New York Jets with 4th pick

FLORHAM PARK, N.J. (AP) — The New York Jets are adding some Big Apple Sauce to their defense.

Cincinnati cornerback

Ahmad "Sauce" Gardner was taken by the Jets with the No. 4 overall pick in the NFL draft Thursday night.

The 6-foot-2, 190-pound shutdown corner-

back didn't allow a touchdown reception in his three-year college career. He'll join free agent signing D.J. Reed to give coach Robert Saleh a new-look

secondary — with both considered No. 1-type cornerbacks.

Gardner, wearing a diamond-encrusted "SAUCE" medallion and

an equally gaudy sauce bottle on a chain around his neck at the draft site in Las Vegas, oozes confidence on and off the field. New York can only

hope he can be as dominant a defender as their previous homegrown shutdown cornerback: Darrelle Revis, who went 14th overall in 2007.

Cleveland's losing skid at 7 after sweep by Angels

ANAHEIM, Calif. (AP) — The Los Angeles Angels haven't won a playoff game in over 12 years, and they haven't finished with a winning record since 2015.

With a five-game winning streak and a wealth of confident players across their roster, the Halos are starting to believe this year will be different, even though it's not yet May.

"We're going to be good this season," rookie left-hander Reid Detmers said.

Taylor Ward drove in two runs, Brandon Marsh had three hits and an RBI, and the Angels completed a four-game sweep of the Cleveland Guardians with a 4-1 victory on Thursday.

Detmers (1-1) pitched five innings of two-hit ball to earn his second career major-league victory for the Angels, while Ward and Marsh hit RBI singles in the third inning of Los Angeles'

12th win in 16 games.

The Halos are six games over .500 for the first time since late June 2018. That's

no small achievement for a franchise that has wasted incredible years from Mike Trout and Shohei Ohtani

during its seven-year play-off drought.

"We've just got to keep this train rolling," said

Marsh, who's fourth in the AL with a team-leading 15 RBIs. "It was a great (series) for everyone in this locker room, and we've just got to keep this going."

Orange County native Austin Hedges homered and had two hits for the Guardians, who have lost the first seven games of their 10-game road trip. Cleveland scored only seven runs in four games against Los Angeles, with five of those coming in Wednesday's blowout loss.

"It's definitely not fun," outfielder Myles Straw said. "None of us want to be going through this, but it's a weird sport. I think we're going to come around, come together and be just fine."

Detmers put together another strong start befitting one of the top left-handed prospects in baseball, walking one and strik-

ing out four.

Los Angeles' hot start to the season is largely due to stellar work by its long-struggling rotation, capped by this four-game series with the starters allowing just three runs in 23 innings. The Angels' bullpen is also much improved: Four relievers combined for four innings of scoreless two-hit ball, with Raisel Iglesias pitching the ninth for his fifth save.

"I don't know about the last three games, but they certainly held us down (today)," Cleveland manager Terry Francona said. "We hit some balls right at people, and we're going to have to continue to do that, to have those at-bats."

Cal Quantrill (1-1) yielded four hits and one earned run over six solid innings for the Guardians, striking out four and walking three.

five RBIs during the series.

Kim had three hits, including two doubles, the second glancing off the top of the left field wall.

"I wanted it to be out so bad," Kim said via inter-

preter, adding with a slight smile, "I'll eat more and do more weight training."

Reliever Tony Santillan hit two batters, walked another and threw a wild pitch while San Diego sent

nine batters to the plate. Santillan avoided further damage when center fielder Jake Fraley made a diving catch of Jake Cronenworth's drive to the warning track.

"From the bench I thought Santillan was trying to throw his slider too hard," Reds manager David Bell said. "He's been so good for us, and we've asked a lot of him."

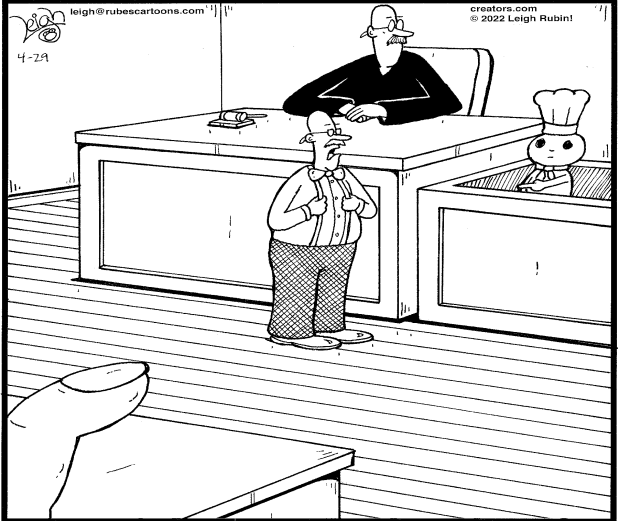

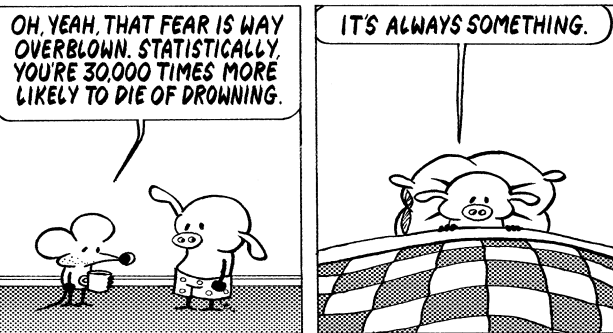

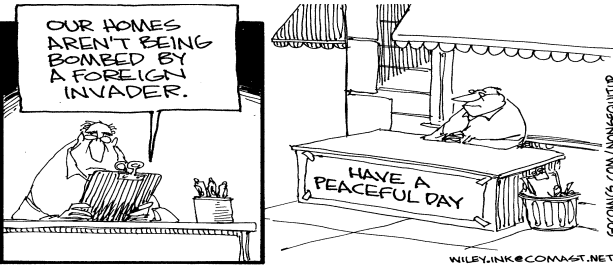
