


# Rep. Cross unveils more than \$5M in funding for Indian Lake projects

Supported initiatives include dredging and pickleball

The weed eradication efforts at Indian Lake received a \$5 million boost this week, and a volunteer-driven fundraising effort to install pickleball courts at Oldfield Beach also received sizable support, with both initiatives included among the \$350 million in one-time project state funding passed by the Ohio House of Representatives in Substitute House Bill 2.

State Rep. Jon Cross (R-Findlay) hosted a press conference Friday, Feb. 9, at Bud's Marine to unveil the totals for the two major Logan County projects, which are among the record amount of \$9.7 million that he helped to secure for Hancock, Hardin and Logan coun-

The statewide, regional and local projects includes the \$5 million that has been committed to dredging at Indian Lake, ensuring longevity of critical water infrastructure; and \$150,000 has been dedicated to build new pickleball courts at Oldfield Beach on Indian Lake, promoting community recreation and wellbeing.

"I will always fight to ensure dollars make their way back to the 83rd House District," Cross said to an enthusiastic crowd gathered at the business, 7169 County Road 38, Huntsville. "These are your tax dollars at work.

"It's an economic shot in the arm for all of those who live here and love it here. I look forward to seeing the transformative effects of these projects for generations to come."

Rep. Cross shared that as a Hardin county native, he grew up coming to Indian Lake for recreational activities with his family. With the recent weed problems at Indian Lake, he and so many others were particularly distressed about the situation, since it was creating a widespread impact on business, tourism and local property owners and

amilies.

"It really shook this community. We were on the verge of losing the lake," he said.

As a result of those concerns, the state representative related that the community came together through the Indian Lake Advocacy Group and other collaborative efforts. Indian Lake also has previously received state funding for weed eradication efforts and for ecological studies performed here. The resulting efforts made the summer season of 2023 a much more successful one for businesses, residents and visitors alike.

for business and enjoyment once again," Rep. Cross said. "You've saved our lake, but now we need to transition to supporting the

Bud's Marine owner Bud Christman from the Indian Lake Advocacy Group accompanied Rep. Cross for the unveiling of the \$5 million in funding, which was the largest project funding amount received in the three-county area for Substitute House Bill 2.

"In the 60 years that I've been here, I've never seen anyone get involved the way that Jon (Cross) has," Christman said, nothing he and Rep. Cross recently met with the Ohio Department of Natural Resources director regarding the weed issue at Indian Lake."I want to thank him for his tremendous efforts.

"We're off to a good start. We need to learn to support the right people and welcome new opportunities."

Noting that dredging is a long-term effort, Rep. Cross said he is hopeful that the

Ohio Senate will match these funds. Then the dredging project will be "about 10 percent funded" over the long-term, he noted.

In recent years, Indian Lake has lost water capacity in a major way, and that's why the dredging is needed, Rep. Cross said.

"It makes our lake safer


lowing their recent local fundraising. Volunteers have been working alongside the ILDC and the Indian Lake State Park on this important recreational effort.

# Boat show dates back to 1955 open house

ccording to a 1978 Examiner article, "a well-attended (1955) open house at a new building constructed by the former Schuler Marina was the forerunner of the annual tradition with all the marinas joining forces for a major exposition the next year."

It was 1956 when the owners of the three primary marine dealers — including Schuler and Spend-A-Day marinas and Major Marine — banded together to attract thousands for a weekend-long display of the latest in water sports.

One of its original organizers, the late William "Bill" Reed, who passed away in 2009, was a staple for more than five decades, greeting visitors and friends in the Spend-A-Day Marina showroom and serving up popcorn and conversation along with his late wife, Marjorie, said son Jim Reed just after his father passed away in 2009.

"He basically taught

(everyone here) how to put on a successful boat show and we plan to continue that tradition."

The elder Mr. Reed, like countless others, was drawn to the lake as a young boater and frequent visitor of the Million Dollar Playground.

"He played at the lake and staved at the lake," said Mr. Reed of his father.

In 1950, the late Mr. Reed opened a small boat rental operation in Russells Point and envisioned Indian Lake becoming a water recreation destina-

Three years later, he expanded the operation to include sales and service and constructed a new facility on Orchard Island. The old location was then dismantled brick by brick and relocated to the new facility, 9481 N. State Route 708, where it continues today.

The Reed family has since acquired the former Major Marine, now known as Indian Lake Marine, at 457 E. Main St., Russells

Both locations will take part in the boat show, along with Bud's Marine, 7189 County Road 38, along State Route 366 east of Russells Point.

The showrooms open daily at 10 a.m. and close Friday and Saturday at 6 p.m. and Thursday and Sunday at 5 p.m.

The Indian Lake Boat show is the annual spring event for the entire Indian Lake area. Boaters, campers, visitors, tourists, and residents look forward to this annual event which marks the beginning of spring activities in the area.
